

CORRECTION

Lewis W. Beck wishes to correct a mistake he made in a pre-publication brochure on the series, The Philosophy of David Hume (Garland Publishing Inc., 18 volumes, 1984). He stated that there would be a reprint of the 1815 edition of Freidrich Heinrich Jacobi's David Hume über den Glauben. It subsequently became possible, however, to reproduce the rare first edition, Breslau 1787, which includes some material omitted from the 1815 edition, with the material added in the 1815 edition as an appendix. Hamilton Beck's Introduction compares the earlier and the later editions and treats of the role of Jacobi in introducing Hume into Germany.

The British Society for the History of Philosophy has been formed to promote and foster all aspects of the study and teaching of the history of philosophy.
