

HUME STUDIES is devoted to historical and systematic research on David Hume.

Manuscripts should be typewritten, double-spaced, xerox or ribbon copy, on good paper 8½ by 11 inches with wide margins. Footnotes should be assembled on separate sheets and placed at the end of the article. Receipt of manuscripts will be acknowledged, but manuscripts cannot be returned unless accompanied by an addressed envelope and postage for Canada or International Reply Coupons for those living outside Canada. Contributors should keep a copy of their manuscript.

HUME STUDIES is published twice a year in April and November. Contributors are encouraged to limit papers to 15 pages of text. Manuscripts will be accepted in English, French, German and Italian. Contributors are requested to use the Selby-Bigge editions of the Treatise and the Enquiries and the Kemp Smith edition of the Dialogues. Quotations should be verified carefully and punctuation and spelling should not be modified since there is at present no standardization. Authors of papers published in HUME STUDIES will receive gratis five copies of the issue. Additional copies may be purchased by making arrangements with the Editor.

The price per subscription per year is \$10.00 for Institutions and \$5.00 for Individuals (in Canadian funds). Duplicates may be obtained (if available) from the Managing Editor at the regular price of single issues (\$5.00).
