# **TWENTY-SIXTH INTERNATIONAL HUME CONFERENCE**

**CORK, IRELAND**

**19-23 July, 1999**

The twenty-sixth International Hume Conference will be held in Cork, Ireland, 19-23 July, 1999, just before the Tenth International Congress on the Enlightenment, which will be held at University College, Dublin, 25-31 July. The Hume Conference theme will be "Society and Mind," construed broadly to include discussions of Hume on the mind, society, social aspects of mind, mental aspects of society, and so on. Papers bearing some relation to the conference theme will be especially welcome, but papers on any aspect of Hume's life and thought will be considered.

Papers should be no more than thirty minutes reading length. All self-references must be deleted for blind reviewing; the author's name should appear only on the cover sheet. Papers may be in English, French, or German, but an abstract in English is required for all papers. Authors are requested to submit papers in triplicate.

The Hume Society has set aside up to \$1000 for the support of graduate students who will be reading papers at the conference. These awards will be given at the discretion of the Conference Co-Directors to those whose papers have been accepted through the usual review process.

## **Colin and Ailsa Turbayne International Berkeley Essay Prize Competition**

Professor and the late Mrs. Colin Turbayne established an International Berkeley Essay Prize competition in conjunction with the Philosophy Department at the University of Rochester.

The next deadline for submitting papers is November 1, 1998. For the 1998 competition, submitted papers should address some aspect of Berkeley's theory of vision. Essays should be new and unpublished and should be written in English and not exceed 5,000 words in length. All references to Berkeley should be to Luce/Jessop, and a MLA or similar standard for notes should be followed. Submissions are blind reviewed and will be judged by members of a review board selected by the Department of Philosophy at the University of Rochester. The winner will be announced March 1, 1999 and will receive a prize of \$2,000. Copies of the winning essays are to be sent to the George Berkeley Library Study Center located in Berkeley's home in Whitehall, Newport, RI.
