## **Colin and Ailsa Turbayne International Berkeley Essay Prize Competition**

Professor and the late Mrs Colin Turnbayne established an International Berkeley Essay Prize competition in conjunction with the Philosophy Department at the University of Rochester.

The next deadline for submitting papers is November 1, 2000. For the 2000 competition, submitted papers should address some aspect of Berkeley's theory of vision. Essays should be new and unpublished and not exceed 5,000 words in length. All references to Berkeley should be to Luce/Jessop, and a MLA or similar standard for notes should be followed. Submissions are blind reviewed and will be judged by members of a review board selected by the Department of Philosophy at the University of Rochester. The winner will be announced March 1, 2001 and will receive a prize of \$2,000. Copies of the winning essays are to be sent to the George Berkeley Library Study Center located in Berkeley's home in Whitehall, Newport, RI.
