# The American Philosophical Association Centennial Series

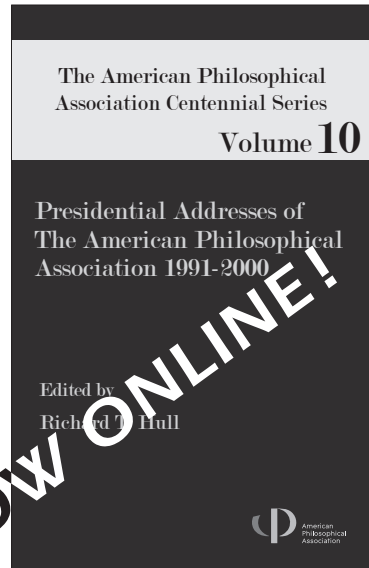

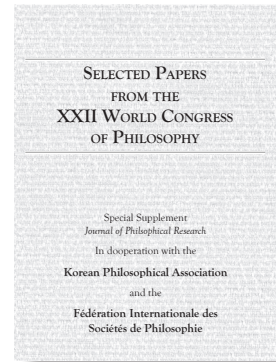

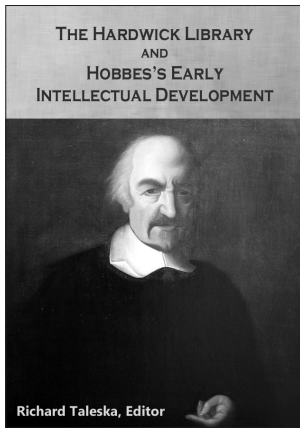

# THE HARDWICK LIBRARY AND HOBBS'S EARLY INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENT

Richard A. Talaska, Editor

This work publishes the entirety of Hobbes's MS E.1.A, "Old Catalogue," the 1630s catalogue of the Hardwick/Chatsworth library. Talaska provides handwriting samples and a full discussion of the problem of identifying Hobbes's handwriting to prove that the "Old Catalogue" is in Hobbes's own handwriting. Talaska goes on to prove that almost all the books in the library were purchased by the Devonshires for Hobbes's own purposes, and that the Catalogue dates to the 1630s.

Hobbes's listings, which give only author's last name, short title, and printer's format, are filled out with full bibliographic information, making it possible for Talaska to date the catalogue and for the reader to find the editions listed. This work will be essential for those studying the intellectual influences upon Hobbes from the time of his Oxford years until the late 1630s.

Long delayed by the editor's premature death, this work is now available for download in PDF format.

# Award for Excellence and Innovation in Philosophy Programs

---

The American Philosophical Association and the Philosophy Documentation Center jointly sponsor an annual *Prize for Excellence and Innovation in Philosophy Programs*. The aim of the prize is to recognize programs that risk undertaking new initiatives and do so with excellence and success. The prize is also intended to publicize these programs so that they may inspire and influence others to follow their lead.

## Award

The winning program receives a plaque, and the winner's host institution receives campus-wide online access to a special collection of philosophy resources for the following year.

## Eligibility and Criteria

Eligible programs include departments of philosophy in colleges and universities, as well as institutes, societies, or other organizations that develop philosophy programs or projects aimed at promoting or developing research, teaching, or the public understanding of philosophy in the United States. Excellence is assessed by a record of achievement, the accomplishment of clearly defined goals, and the appropriateness of the program for emulation by others in the field.

Any APA member familiar with a program, including those involved in its creation or direction, may nominate it. The selection committee consists of five people appointed by the APA's Committee on Lectures, Publications, and Research, and includes two representatives of the Philosophy Documentation Center.
