The Sixteenth Hume Conference will be held jointly with the British Society for the History of Philosophy at the University of Lancaster from the evening of August 21 to the evening of August 24, 1989. The meeting is being hosted by the University of Lancaster as part of the university's Silver Jubilee Celebrations. While papers on all aspects of Hume studies will be considered, the organizing committee is particularly interested in receiving papers of potentially publishable quality which relate issues in Hume's thought to intellectual developments in Britain and Europe in the eighteenth century -- or which relate Hume to other personalities in the history of thought.

Papers should be a minimum of 25 and a maximum of 40 minutes reading length with self-references eliminated for blind refereeing. *Three copies should be sent to the Secretary of the Hume Society postmarked no later than OCTOBER 31, 1988.*
